



**Do not buy a
"survival" seed bank
until you read and digest
this information!**

When we began this business over five years ago, our sole objective was to create the finest seed bank on the market. Sales were (and always have been) secondary. We were strongly encouraged by very smart advertising people representing major broadcast markets that we could turn our business into a multi-million dollar enterprise if we would offer a seed bank selling in the \$19-49 range. But money is not what drives us; in fact, the bulk of our income comes from a totally unrelated business.

So why did we enter this market? Like you, we are concerned about what's happening in our world so we decided to become as self-sufficient as possible. A big part of that has to do with food production. We grow our own food, and we teach others how to do the same. Our goal is to provide a turn-key solution for those who want to become food self-sufficient (at least as far as the garden goes). And for your seed bank to be truly self-sustaining, many factors need to be addressed. If you fall short in any one of them, you do not have a true "survival seed bank" regardless of how much money you invest.

Our banks are not cheap compared to other companies because our Liberty Seed Banks are very different from other seed kits. We *strongly* encourage you to do the research and make a wise decision. You may be OK if you buy Water Filter A over Water Filter B, but that is not true as it pertains to seed banks. If you are interested in *survival*, monetary cost is a factor that figures low in the hierarchy. Your *primary* concern should be whether or not the collection of seeds will do what you need it to; and secondarily, whether or not the seed bank is a good value. Let's look at both considerations.

CONSIDERATION 1: Is this a bank that my family could actually survive on?

If you are purchasing seeds to provide for the needs of your family in the event that traditional food sources become unreliable or unavailable, there are certain questions you must ask.

- 1) Will your seed bank produce enough food to feed the number of people you will be providing for and still provide a reserve cushion in the event of a natural catastrophe (flood, rabbit, virus, gardening newbie errors, etc.)?
- 2) Are the seeds *USDA certified*, which means that they have been tested and meet (or exceed) the USDA minimum germination requirements for that breed? Are the seeds fresh, or have they been sitting on a shelf or in a silo for an extended period of time?

- 3) Will the combination of varieties in your bank provide all of the vitamins and nutrients your family will need to remain healthy? And will they provide a varied, interesting and tasty diet as well? (Note that proteins are generally derived elsewhere, such as from eggs, milk, meat or a bean/rice combination.)
- 4) Are the varieties in your seed kit specifically selected to perform well in your USDA growing zone, or are you getting the same bank in Orlando that was shipped to the fellow in Minneapolis?
- 5) If you are not an experienced food grower, do you have immediate access to detailed, regionally specific information that will teach you how to garden successfully and get you up and running as soon as possible? And do you also have ready access to plant nutrients that will enable you to be as productive and successful as possible even with your very first garden?
- 6) Are your seeds fully protected from light, moisture, humidity, insects and vermin within a rugged, airtight, fully re-sealable container?

Texas Ready Liberty Seed Banks pass all of these requirements with flying colors, as will be shown below.



CONSIDERATION 2: Is this seed bank a good value?

- 1) Our seed banks are not inexpensive. But it simply isn't possible to provide a true "survival seed bank" solution for under \$100. There are plenty of kits available on the market for less money, but bear in mind that you'll get exactly what you pay for (and in some cases, substantially less). Each of our banks includes over 70 different heirloom varieties, each with a *very* generous quantity of seed. To replicate one of our \$125 Piggy Banks from scratch would cost well in excess of \$500, along with a huge expenditure of time and effort.
- 2) The seeds we sell are both fresh *and* USDA certified. In fact, an independent study pegged the germination rate of our seeds at 96%, far outperforming the competition. (See <http://survivalseedbankscam.com/>) We get similar results in our own test gardens.
- 3) The varieties we select represent some of the hardiest, most productive breeds available. Additionally, the varieties in each bank have been carefully chosen with your family's annual nutritional requirements in mind. We don't just give you a squash, we give you summer squash, winter squash and zucchini. We give you hot, mild and sweet peppers. You'll get lima, pinto and green beans in both pole and bush forms. You'll get a sweet pea, a flat pea, a cowpea and a field pea. Head lettuce, leaf lettuce and romaine lettuce; bulb onions and bunching onions; determinate and indeterminate tomatoes - you get the idea. Then we throw in various spices to make it all taste great!

4) Your geographical area is of *paramount* importance when determining which seeds will perform well for you. Texas Ready banks are the only seed kits on the market that are configured by region. Therefore, if you live in a colder climate (USDA Growing Zones 2-6) you will receive varieties that are cold resistant and come to maturity within a relatively short period of time. And if you live in a southern region (USDA Zones 7 or higher), you will receive a large selection of heat tolerant varieties to rotate throughout the year.



5) Our selection of books and training manuals are the best on the market, especially for persons without previous growing experience. (Many of these books come free with our larger sized banks.) Furthermore, we're happy to answer your questions, as we not only sell seeds, we are experienced food growers as well!

Texas Ready also sells specialized plant nutrition to kick-start your garden and make you food productive right out of the chute.

6) It may not sound terribly important, but the container you use to store your seeds is critical to their safety and survival. Seeds are living organisms and must be protected from light, water and anything that might want to feed on them. Our banks are housed in genuine steel US Army ammo cans that are virtually indestructible. These boxes may be opened and closed at will, and they will fully protect your seeds if kept in a cool environment.

Bottom Line

Texas Ready Liberty Seed Banks are the only banks that can truly be counted on for survival in an off-grid situation. Not only that, when both features and cost are taken into account, they represent the best value available in the seed bank market.

If you have made it to the end of this paper, then you are now able to make a more informed decision than the vast majority of preppers who are governed solely by a price tag. Study your options, buy a bank, and go forth and grow!

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
